As described in General Order 17.031, blood borne pathogens training will be delivered on the training days. This program is known as the Duke Infectious Disease Response Training (DIDRT) and is a collaborative effort between Duke University and George Mason University. Certificates will be issued upon completion.

All participants must register on line through DIDRT Learning Management System (LMS). After you create an account, you need to register for the dates you are assigned to attend (per GO 17.031 or per agreement to change dates) on the following website and complete the pre-course assessment. Instructions on how to register for training are provided below.

Go to <http://seerm.gmu.edu/didrt/> Scroll down to “Register for Training” and click the link to create your account. *When creating your account, under DIDRT Training Site select George Mason Univ.*

Once your account has been created:

1. Log into your account at <http://didrt.dhvi.duke.edu/>
2. Select Course Catalog tab from the menu along the top of the page
3. Select Catalog: GMU RBL-On Site
4. Select Catalog: Operations Level 5. Select GMU-212 On Site IDR Operations and BBP First Responders
5. Hit the enroll icon (upper left)
6. Select the date of your attendance
7. Go to my account
8. Hit “GO” for GMU-212
9. Complete pre-course assessment

The pre-course assessment needs to be completed prior to your attendance in class.

Please note it is important that each participant attend on the day they selected when registering. It is possible to “drop” a session and “add” a different session in the LMS if entered in error or you have an approved schedule change. Please complete the pre-course assessment prior to training. Additionally, you **must retain your username and password** (make a note and bring to the training) as this will be needed to complete the post-course assessment and evaluation at the end of their training.
