Effective March 1, 2019 Hazmat 1110 has been taken out of service in an effort to make the unit more relevant to the mission and goals of Fauquier County Fire and Rescue. The unit has been repurposed for the role of on scene rehabilitation, lighting, breathing air replenishment, light refreshments, minor fluid spill abatement, and sheltering during extreme weather events.

The following equipment has been added or removed from the unit.

### Added:

Coolers, portable lighting, portable power supply (generator), cord reels, tents, cooling chairs, cooling towels, hot/cold packs, tables, chairs, vitals taking supplies, gross decontamination supplies (for fire/ems personnel), 15 additional SCBA cylinders.

### Removed:

Hazmat atmospheric monitoring equipment, patch and plug equipment, spill containment and clean-up equipment.

This unit will be configured in CAD as IS1110 and will be dispatched during extreme weather days as designated by department leadership and multiple alarm incidents. IS1110 can be special requested by units for any incident where it can be of benefit.

Personnel who meet the following criteria will be eligible for vehicle driver release:

- Certified at the level of EVOC 3
- Released at the EMT- B level or higher and/or released firefighters
- Released to drive either ambulances or engines
- Completed operational familiarization to include showing proficiency in the operation of on board equipment
- Logged driving time (10 hours for ambulance only drivers, 5 hours for engine drivers, no hours required for previous HazMat 1110 drivers)
